



T&N Van Service – Concise Company History

T&N Van Service was formed in March of 1992 by the four partners, David Nelson, Russell Taddei Jr., Donald Taddei and Kenneth Taddei. Each partner had previous experience in the moving business. Three had worked at D. Cristinzio, Inc. and the fourth at Menlo Movers, Inc.

Our first substantial space was rented in Pennsauken, occupying 17,000 square feet. We experienced steady growth which allowed us to continually increase our space in increments of 15,000 sq. ft. per year until we eventually occupied 75,000 sq.ft. by 1997. Our primary business focus was in the banking and insurance markets, with specialties including the rapidly growing ATM market and electronic equipment. Right from our beginning T&N was recognized as the mover of choice for projects requiring high quality, detail oriented workmanship.

In April 1998, having outgrown our original location, we relocated to our present address at 1510 Lancer Drive in Moorestown, NJ. The facility was designed and built to meet our specific requirements which greatly enhanced our daily operational efficiency. We continued to experience substantial growth through the end of the decade, consistently adding staff across our operation to meet the demands of our client base. We are most proud of the fact that we were able to maintain our ability to provide outstanding service to our ever growing group of customers. This is evidenced by the fact that the majority of our initial clients remain loyal T&N customers as we enter our third decade.

In 2006 our on going success allowed us to purchase our facility. As the years have passed we continue to maintain and enhance our facility to the point that the universal reaction of those clients who choose to visit regularly comment on how “very impressed” they are on our cleanliness and organization. “This isn’t what we are accustomed to” as a mover’s warehouse. This year we made a major investment by installing a state-of-the-art lighting system. In addition to the substantial cost savings, we are proud that the lighting project is projected to save over 150,000 pounds of Carbon Dioxide emissions annually, equivalent to saving over 9,000 gallons of gasoline each year.

We would be remiss if we did not also note our on-going commitment to giving back to our community. Some of these activities include regularly providing our crews and trucks to assist local non-profits and charities in staging their various events, with a special focus on those that help underprivileged children in the Delaware Valley.
